

GENERAL INFORMATION

The “Vehicle Rescue in the New Millennium” Train-The-Trainer event is open to anyone with no pre-requisites or qualifications required to attend. Call **713-502-8470** or **713-553-6279** to reserve your seat in class and to make payment arrangements. Seating is limited and your seat in class will be confirmed via email or fax when payment is received.

DATES – This 2-day training event will be held Thu/Fri June 10/11, 2010 at the Fairchild Air Force Base near Spokane, Washington

LOCATION – The class location will be: Fairfield AFB Fire Department, 1001 West Boston Ave, Fairchild AFB, WA 99011 from 0800-1700

COST – The cost to attend this 2-day event is \$250 per person. This fee will include 2 days of training and all training materials. Lunch at the class site will be provided at no cost each day. Due to the limited space available in this class, and the cost to duplicate and package all materials, the \$250 fee will NOT be refundable.
